Emergency Preparedness & Public Safety Committee Meeting Draft Minutes

Monday, December 18, 2017, from 5:30 - 7:30 pm Mid-Valley Regional Library 16244 Nordoff Street, North Hills, CA 91343

Minutes items are same as agenda number, but may have been addressed in a different order

- 1. Welcome, Roll Call and announcement of Voting Eligibility: 5:35 p.m. All three Committee members present: Dave Brown, Maggie Elliott, Kreshell Ramey Also 17 Stakeholders participating
- 2. Review & approval of prior meeting minutes from July 6, 2017, as corrected
- 3. General Public Comments:

The majority of comments consisted of issues relating to saturation parking on Haskell Ave between Chase and Nordoff. Also high rates of traffic speeds in the same area.

- 4.Official and Guest Speakers: Mikkie Loi-NWNC and Martha Cortez-PCNC provided insight into the featured agenda topic, item # 7, concerning Haskell Ave parking related issues.
- 5. Discussion regarding requesting all NHW NC Board members and possibly all Committee members as well, to file an updated Code of Conduct form. Item tabled.
- 6.Referred from NHWNC General Board meeting on 11/16/2017 Discussion and possible recommendation regarding adding security to the Neighborhood Council General Board meetings henceforth. Also discussion regarding a security awareness presentation recommendation. Item tabled. Venue protocols will be discovered.
- 7.Discussion regarding parking issues on Haskell Ave, including driveway, mailbox, and trash pickup blocking. A **letter** will be prepared for Board approval to send to CD12 requesting red curb painting on either side of driveways in the affected area. This is particularly significant for the incoming traffic direction, as visibility is restricted by the close parked cars. Also a request for street sweeping signage. The immediately adjacent area has Monday & Friday posted sweeping, so it would make sense to request identical. Because of the high prevailing traffic speeds on Haskell, even near the Napa Street school, request for enhanced enforcement as able.
- 8.The "Club" car steering wheel locking device. **Motion**: The NC obtain a bulk discount direct from the manufacturer on units and making them available to Stakeholders. At or above \$2,000 qualifies for free shipping. Depending on model number this would be 150 to 170 units. (See: https://winner-intl.com/law-enforcement/ for item description) KR-2nd. **Yes**-unanimous

10.CERT 1 class, Jan 16 to Feb 27th at Kaiser Permanente Medical Center, 7 classes total. This class would be open to all everyone and is highly recommended Discussion & Motion: to approve recommending to main Board allocating NTE \$200 for class meeting refreshments.

- 14. C.E.M.P. California Emergency Mobile Patrol, all volunteer, full service suburban Search & Rescue team based in Los Angeles San Fernando Valley, but covers other areas under mutual aid. Discussion and **Motion:** To support upgrading dispatch software, previously tabled, or other needs as presented. Recommend to main Board, support via NPG, **NTE \$500**. KR-2nd, **Yes**-unanimous
- 15. Discussion regarding the NHW Neighborhood Council facilitating a workshop on gun owner safety and current laws.

  Main presenters would be LAPD gun team members. Hosting location to be determined Any costs would be limited to venue rental and attendee refreshments.

  This might consist of joint support and promotion by several NC's.

- 16."Reducing Crime and Keeping California Safe Act of 2018"
  A statewide ballot initiative called the "Reducing Crime and Keeping California Safe Act of 2018"
  has been submitted to the Attorney General for title and summary. This initiative will enact a broad swath of critical reforms including preventing the early release of violent offenders, holding serial thieves accountable, reinstating DNA collection for a number of misdemeanor crimes
