## **Summary of Motions Introduced (*New Legislation*)**

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**Council File 23-1200-S30, Candice Cho / Board of Human Relations Commissioners / Commission Appointment (*Mayor*):** Introduced March 16, 2023 and referred to Civil Rights, Equity, Immigration, Aging and Disability Committee. Mayor's report is relative to the appointment of Ms. Candice Cho to the Board of Human Relations Commissioners for the term ending June 30, 2024.

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**Council File 23-1200-S31, Hiram Sims / Board of Library Commissioners / Commission Appointment (*Mayor*):** Introduced March 16, 2023 and referred to Neighborhoods and Community Enrichment Committee. Mayor's report is relative to the appointment of Mr. Hiram Sims to the Board of Library Commissioners, for the term ending June 30, 2027.

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**Council File 23-1200-S29, Linda Blank / Board of Library Commissioners / Commission Appointment (Mayor):** Introduced March 10, 2023 and referred to Neighborhoods and Community Enrichment Committee. Mayor's report is relative to the appointment of Ms. Linda Blank to the Board of Library Commissioners, for the term ending June 30, 2024.

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**Council File 23-1200-S25, Jacob Lipa / House LA Citizens Oversight Committee / Commission Appointment (Mayor):** Introduced February 28, 2023 and referred to Housing and Homelessness Committee. Mayor's report is relative to the appointment of Mr. Jacob Lipa to the newly created House LA Citizens Oversight Committee, for the term ending June 30, 2024.

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**Council File 23-0306, Speed Hump Program / Elementary Schools (Krekorian – Hernandez - Hutt):** Introduced March 15, 2023 and referred to Transportation Committee. Motion is instructing the Department of Transportation to report on the feasibility of establishing a dedicated speed hump program for elementary schools, including the required funding and staffing resources and a timeline for execution.

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**Council File 23-0304, Crossing Guard Program / Los Angeles Unified School District / Expedited Hiring / Volunteer Program (McOsker - Krekorian):** Introduced March 15, 2023 and referred to Personnel, Audits, and Hiring Committee. Motion is instructing the Department of Transportation (DOT), with assistance of the Personnel Department, to report to the Personnel, Audits, & Hiring Committee on the status of the Crossing Guard Program; potential ways to expedite the hiring of crossing guards, including reducing the time needed to complete the criminal background checks and obtain medical clearance from the City's Medical Services Division; DOT's coordination efforts with the Los Angeles Unified School District; and the potential to develop a program for local volunteers to assist in crossing guard duties.

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**Council File 23-0303, Citywide Harassment Training Program / Workplace Gender Transition Guidelines / Transgender Advisory Council / LGBTQIA+ Related Training Material (McOsker – Yaroslavsky – Hernandez):** Introduced March 15, 2023 and referred to Personnel, Audits, and Hiring Committee. Motion is instructing the Personnel Department to review and update any training materials that relate to LGBTQIA+ people, including but not limited to the mandatory Citywide harassment training program, and the Workplace Gender Transition Guidelines, in consultation with the City's Transgender Advisory Council, recently-transitioned employees interested in sharing their feedback, and other stakeholders.

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**Council File 23-0302, Emergency Housing Vouchers (EHV) / Housing Authority of the City of Los Angeles / Housing Navigators / Case Managers / Extensions / Appeal Process (Blumenfield – Raman - Yaroslavsky):** Introduced March 15, 2023 and referred to Homelessness Committee. Motion is requesting HACLA to report within 15 days on improving communication between HACLA case managers and EHV participants and the housing navigators/case managers inclusive of addressing staff transition, a more responsive appeals process, updates on pending status, notification for expiring EHVs, and additional ways to contact HACLA staff.

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**Council File 23-0270, Diversion and Recidivism Programs / Los Angeles Police Department (McOske – Rodriguez – Harris-Dawson):** Introduced March 8, 2023 and referred to Public Safety Committee. Motion is instructing the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to report to the Council with an overview all diversion and recidivism programs implemented by the LAPD or in collaboration with other agencies, including metrics for each program, challenges to implementations, and an evaluation of their success in meeting diversion objectives. The report should also include recommendations to increase participation and improve the effectiveness of each program, as well as the potential effectiveness and feasibility of incorporating existing City resources.

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**Council File 23-0264, Emergency Homeless Shelter / Property Owners and Providers / Notification Requirement / Permitting Process (McOske - Hutt):**

Introduced March 7, 2023 and referred to Planning and Land Use Management Committee. Motion is instructing the Planning Department, the Department of Building and Safety, and the Housing Department, in consultation with the City Attorney, to prepare a report with recommendations, and any needed amendments to the Municipal Code, to clarify the notification requirements of emergency homeless shelter property owners when a homeless shelter provider has not been identified at the time the project application is filed, and is being reviewed through the Plan Check and building permitting process.

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**Council File 23-0244, Administrative Citation Enforcement (ACE) Program / City Attorney / Enforcement Officer / Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) (McOsker – Harris-Dawson):** Introduced March 7, 2023 and referred to Public Safety Committee. Resolution is adding the City Attorney as an Enforcement Officer empowered to enforce any and all violations of any provision of the LAMC under either or both of 11.00 or 11.2

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**Council File 23-0243, Federal Immigration Enforcement / City Resources, Property, Personnel / Prohibit Use / Compliance Monitoring Report (Hernandez – Raman – Soto-Martinez – Hutt - Price):** Introduced March 7, 2023 and referred to Civil Rights, Equity, Immigration, Aging and Disability Committee. Motion is requesting the City Attorney to prepare and present a draft ordinance within 60 days to prohibit, to the extent permissible by law, any City resources, property, or personnel from being utilized for any federal immigration enforcement or to cooperate with federal immigration authorities in the execution of their duties connected to federal immigration enforcement.

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**Council File 23-0002-S37, SB 50 (Bradford) / Peace Officer / Traffic Stop / Low Level Violation / Prohibition (*Harris-Dawson – Hutt – Soto-Martinez*):** Introduced March 7, 2023 and referred to Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee. Resolution is requesting that the City of Los Angeles include in its 2023-2024 State Legislative Program SUPPORT for SB 50 (Bradford) that would prohibit a peace officer from initiating a traffic stop for a low-level violation, unless there is a separate, independent reason.

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**Council File 23-0002-S36, SB 44 (Umberg) / Fentanyl Manufacturing and Distribution / Potential of Criminal Liability / Written Notice Requirement (*McOsker – Rodriguez - Krekorian*):** Introduced March 7 2023 and Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee. Resolution is requesting that the City of Los Angeles include in its 2023-2024 State Legislative Program SUPPORT for SB 44 (Umberg) which would require a written notice be provided to those convicted or who have plead guilty to the manufacture or distribution of fentanyl on the potential for criminal liability resulting from any deaths related to the offense.

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**Council File 22-1196-S1, Independent Redistricting Commission / City Chapter Amendment / Ballot Measure / November 2022 (Chief Legislative Analyst)(CLA):** Introduced March 10, 2023 and referred to Ad Hoc Committee on City Governance Reform; Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee. CLA report is relative to Independent Redistricting Charter Reform.
